Fix your leaks today.

It's just a leaky faucet, right?

You may be surprised. According to the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) WaterSense® program, minor household leaks account for more than 1 trillion gallons of wasted water every year.

Fixing leaks is always a good idea, but March 20th–26th is national Fix a Leak Week. It's the perfect time to remember to check your faucets, toilets and sprinklers for leaks and fix them. With a little help from your local hardware store, repairing most leaks is pretty easy.

Following are a few water-saving tips:

- Reduce faucet leaks by checking faucet washers and gaskets for wear and, if necessary, replace the faucet with a WaterSense® labeled model.
- Is your toilet running right now? That could be wasting over 200 gallons a day. Leaky toilets are most often the result of a worn toilet flapper valve. This is a simple repair, but be sure to check with your hardware store for the correct valve for your toilet.
- Automatic landscape irrigation systems should also be checked each spring before use to make sure they are not damaged by frost or freezing.
